

How to Determine the Semester Average

- All teachers will use the 12-point scale.
- Each quarter grade counts as 2/5. The examination counts as 1/5.
- A teacher will double each of the two quarter grades, will add the semester examination, and will divide by 5.

For example –

Student's first quarter grade C+

Student's second quarter grade B

Student's exam grade D-

1Q	C+	6
1Q	C+	6
2Q	B	8
2Q	B	8
Ex	D-	1

$$29 \div 5 = 5.8 = 6 = \text{C+ [semester average]}$$

- For students exempt from the semester examination, the teacher will average the two quarter grades alone.
- The minimum academic requirement for passing for the semester is a solid D- (solid 1 on the 12-point scale) average. A .5 will not be rounded to a 1.
- A student who fails the first semester must make at least a D+ for the second semester in order to pass for the year.
- A student who fails two quarters in a single semester will not be allowed to take the semester examination and will, thus, fail for the semester.
